RESOLUTION 86-142

IMPROVING THE ROAD SERVICE AREA SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, the assembly, in 1986, established two inspector positions and an additional half time foreman position; and

WHEREAS, these positions took away decision making and planning responsibilities from the local neighborhood supervisor; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to decrease expenditures; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to increase the control of the local neighborhoods in the face of numerous complaints about a lack of communication and planning;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That those inspector positions and the foreman position are abolished.

Section 2. That the contracts for maintenance will be planned, formulated and executed on a neighborhood basis. A neighborhood is defined as a unit composed of streets and roads and neighbors who have agreed to act together to maintain those roads within their neighborhood. The agreement shall be reached at a public meeting of the road service board and shall be signed by each of the participating parties. Any party may withdraw from the neighborhood at any time and subsequent maintenance shall be performed on that road or section of road contiguous to their property as a separate contract.

Section 3. That this resolution takes effect immediately upon its adoption.
