KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

RESOLUTION 89-136

REQUESTING THE ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND PUBLIC FACILITIES TO MOVE UP THE SEWARD HIGHWAY PROJECT, MILEPOST 50-65, ON THEIR SIX YEAR PLAN.

WHEREAS, the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT & PF), Central Region, annually establishes a six year plan for prioritizing federally funded highway projects; and

WHEREAS, the Seward Highway project, Milepost 50-65 Phase I has been slated for construction in FY'96; and

WHEREAS, Phase II is not yet scheduled; and

WHEREAS, this is the narrow, winding stretch of highway between Summit Lake and Turnagain Pass; and

WHEREAS, winter conditions are often icy and dangerous; and


WHEREAS, every motorist traveling to the peninsula uses this stretch of road;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the assembly urges DOT & PF to accelerate this project and move it up on their six year plan with construction to begin as soon as possible following the Sterling Highway project Milepost 79-94 and reconstruction of the Spur Highway.

Section 2. That copies of this resolution shall be sent to Mark Hickey, Commissioner of the DOT & PF; Kit Duke, Regional Director for Central region; Tommy Heinrich, Director of Design & Construction for Central Region; John Tolley, Chief of the Planning Staff for Central region; and Alaska State Legislators from Districts 5, 6 and 7.
