Resolution 89-18

APPROVING THE MAYOR'S PROPOSAL FOR THE FORMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY PLANNING DISTRICT AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE LOCAL EMERGENCY PLANNING COMMITTEE FOR THAT DISTRICT

WHEREAS, Congress passed the Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act of 1986 as a part of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorizations Act (SARA); and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Right-To-Know Act is to help American communities deal safely and effectively with hazardous substances that are used throughout the communities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that act the State of Alaska has established the State Emergency Response Commission (SERC); and

WHEREAS, to carry out the purposes of the Act the areas of the State will be divided into local emergency planning districts with each district having a local emergency planning committee to serve as an ongoing forum to assist in accomplishing the planning and reporting required by the law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor seeks authorization of the assembly to request the State Emergency Response Commission to designate the Kenai Peninsula Borough as a Local Emergency Planning District (LEPD) and approval of the appointment of members to the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC);


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:


Section 1. That the assembly authorizes the Mayor to request the State Emergency Response Committee to designate the Kenai Peninsula Borough as a Local Emergency Planning District pursuant to the Emergency Planning and Community Right-To-Know Act of 1986. The Assembly further approves appointment of the persons as shown on the attached list as members of the local emergency planning committee upon acceptance of those appointees by the State Emergency Response Commission.


Section 2. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
