RESOLUTION 89-34

OPPOSING LEGISLATION RAISING TAXES ON THE SALE OF GASOLINE

WHEREAS, people in the Kenai Peninsula Borough in Alaska rely heavily on automobiles for transportation; and

WHEREAS, a substantial portion of the price of gasoline for vehicles already includes federal taxes; and

WHEREAS, it would be unfair to consumers to impose additional or new federal or state taxes on the price of gasoline, unless the taxes are directly related to transportation services;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Kenai Peninsula Borough assembly is opposed to the imposition of new or additional federal or state taxes on the sale or price of gasoline, unless those taxes are directly related to the cost of transportation services provided by the federal or state government.

Section 2. That the Borough Clerk shall provide a copy of this resolution to Governor Steve Cowper and Senators John Binkley, Mike Szymanski, Jalmar Kerttula, and Paul Fischer; Representatives Bette Cato, Mike Navarre, C.E. Swackhammer, Kay Wallis, and Jim Zawacki.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
