REQUESTING EXXON TO ROTATE VESSEL CONTRACTS IN THE OIL SPILL CLEANUP EFFORT

WHEREAS, the Exxon oil spill has impacted many coastal areas of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, Exxon has been involved in a cleanup effort since March 24; and

WHEREAS, numerous vessels have been hired by Exxon to assist in the cleanup, and have been on contract for lengthy amounts of time; and

WHEREAS, many hundreds of vessels are qualified and available to work on the oil spill cleanup effort;


BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That Exxon is requested to clearly define the criteria used in selecting vessels contracted in the various aspects of oil-spill clean-up work in progress in the coastal waters of the Kenai Peninsula.


Section 2. That Exxon is requested to rotate vessel contracts so that new, qualified vessels can participate in the cleanup effort.

Section 3. That a copy of this resolution is faxed immediately to the appropriate Exxon authorities, Steve Cowper, Governor of Alaska, Dennis D. Kelso, Commissioner of Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation, Ted Stevens and Frank Murkowski, U. S. Senate, and Don Young, U. S. House of Representatives.
