PROVIDING FOR CONVEYANCE OF CERTAIN LANDS FROM THE STATE OF ALASKA TO THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough may obtain lands from the State of Alaska for public purposes under the authority in Section 810 of the Alaska Statutes; and

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the borough's attention that a certain parcel of land is available for acquisition within the Hope area; and

WHEREAS, this selection has been approved by the residents of Hope through its community council in September 1988, the Hope Advisory Planning Commission on August 17, 1988, and the Kenai Peninsula Borough Planning Commission at its meeting held April 4, 1988; and

WHEREAS, the residents of Hope have, along with approving the selection of this land, determined the best use for this parcel would be for a community museum, to be managed by the Hope/Sunrise Historical Society, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, due to the length of time the Hope/Sunrise Historical Society has tried to obtain this site, the land should be acquired and a lease processed as expeditiously as possible;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That it is hereby requested that the following described parcel of land be conveyed from the State of Alaska to the Kenai Peninsula Borough for public purposes in accordance with Section 810 of Alaska Statutes:

ADL 201302 Lot 2, U.S.S. 3189 1.50 acres

Section 2. Upon receipt of this land the Kenai Peninsula Borough will immediately issue a lease of this parcel to the Hope/Sunrise Historical Society for the designated purpose of a community museum.
