RESOLUTION 90-35

REQUESTING THE STATE OF ALASKA TO APPROVE A VIEWING AREA AT ANCHOR POINT.

WHEREAS, the Anchor Point Chamber of Commerce proposes to construct an 8 foot by 16 foot visitor viewing deck and mark it with a sign at the westerly end of Anchor River Beach Road, and

WHEREAS, the property for this site is owned by the State and managed by the Department of Natural Resources, and

WHEREAS, the Anchor Point Chamber of Commerce would fund this project and only needs the permission of the DNR, and

WHEREAS, the would include panels with historical information and the sign would identify the location as the most westerly highway point in North America.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:


Section 1. That the Assembly supports the efforts of Anchor Point to locate a viewing site at Anchor Point and request the State of Alaska Department of Natural resources and any other agencies involved to grant permission for the construction of this facility.
