KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

RESOLUTION 90-48

DECLARING THE TEN FUEL STORAGE TANKS REMOVED FROM BOROUGH FACILITIES SURPLUS PROPERTY AND AUTHORIZING THEIR DISPOSAL TO KENAI PENINSULA RECYCLING

WHEREAS, ten former underground fuel storage tanks have been removed from Borough facilities in accordance with Federal regulations or because of identified leaking; and

WHEREAS, the tanks cannot be used for storage of any substance since their integrity is questionable due to leaks or age; and

WHEREAS, Kenai Peninsula Recycling has offered to clean the tanks, remove sludge for disposal at the Borough's household hazardous waste Spring cleanup, and cut the tanks into scrap metal; and

WHEREAS, continued storage of the tanks reduces useful area at the Borough Maintenance Shop;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Assembly declares the ten fuel tanks surplus property and authorizes disposal of the tanks to Kenai Peninsula Recycling for scrap metal in exchange for cleaning out the tanks.

Section 2. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
