KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

RESOLUTION 91-3

PROVIDING FOR OPERATION OF THE SEWARD TRANSFER FACILITY AND SOLDOTNA BALING FACILITY BY BOROUGH EMPLOYEES

WHEREAS, a Seward solid waste transfer facility and a Soldotna baling facility are scheduled for completion during the fall of 1991; and

WHEREAS, the Borough presently operates the Homer Baler facility with Borough employees; and

WHEREAS, the method of operations of the facilities once they are completed must be determined for budgetary purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Code of Ordinances, Chapter 10.04, Section 10.04.040, states that unless otherwise authorized by the assembly, the mayor shall provide for the maintenance of disposal facilities within each disposal area to be effected by contract let to the lowest responsible bidder, including listed terms, and conditions; and

WHEREAS, due to the financial interest the Borough has in the structures and equipment, the regulatory restrictions on the operations of solid waste facilities, and the environmental liabilities, it is in the Borough's best interest to operate the facilities with Borough employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the Kenai Peninsula Borough solid waste facilities in Seward and Soldotna be operated by Borough employees.

Section 2. That the transfer of waste from the Seward transfer site to the Soldotna balefill be contracted by competitive bidding.

Section 3. That the Mayor is authorized to execute all documents necessary in accordance with this resolution.

Section 4. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
