RESOLUTION 91-8

AUTHORIZING A USE PERMIT TO THE CITY OF SOLDOTNA FOR LOCATION OF THE ORIGINAL SOLDOTNA POST OFFICE BUILDING ON A PORTION OF LOT A ASPEN FLATS SUBDIVISION ADDITION 4

WHEREAS, the borough purchased Lots A and B of Aspen Flats Subdivision Addition 4 for the purpose of enlarging the Soldotna Elementary School site; and

WHEREAS, the first Soldotna Post Office building is located on Lot A; and

WHEREAS, the Soldotna Historical Society and Museum desires to retain the building for historical purposes on the original site; and

WHEREAS, the borough has agreed that the building may remain on the original site but must be moved to a different location on the original site so as not to interfere with the development plans of the lot in conjunction with the school; and

WHEREAS, a suitable location on the site has been found and agreed upon; and

WHEREAS, the City of Soldotna adopted Resolution 90-32 recognizing the historical significance of the building and waiving such building codes as may be necessary to facilitate the preservation of the building;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That a free use permit may be issued to the City of Soldotna for use of a portion of Lot A, Aspen Flats Subdivision Addition 4 for the purpose of locating the former Soldotna Post Office building.

Section 2. That the Mayor is authorized to sign any documents necessary to effectuate this resolution and deemed to be in the best interests of the borough.

Section 3. That this resolution takes effect upon its adoption.
