KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH

RESOLUTION 91-36

AUTHORIZING THE RELOCATION OF CONTAMINATED SOILS GENERATED FROM THE REMOVAL OF UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANKS AT BOROUGH-OWNED FACILITIES AND THE COOK'S TESORO CLEAN-UP SITE TO THE SOLDOTNA AND HOMER LANDFILL SITES FOR STORAGE AND TREATMENT OF THE SOIL UNTIL FINAL DISPOSAL

WHEREAS, the borough has soils contaminated with fuel oil on its school sites, and the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation has material located at Cook's Tesoro in Sterling; and

WHEREAS, the best interests of the public dictate these soils should be moved to other locations more suitable for storage and treatment; and

WHEREAS, the borough landfills provide a suitable location for treatment and storage of these soils until they are cleaned;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

Section 1. That the assembly authorizes relocation of contaminated soils from the borough school sites and facilities to the Homer and Soldotna landfill sites for storage and treatment until final disposal.

Section 2. That the assembly authorizes relocation of contaminated soil removed during the Cook's Tesoro site cleanup in Sterling to the Soldotna Landfill by June 20, 1991 for temporary storage and treatment for a period not to exceed two years. The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation shall be responsible for compliance with and funding of all stipulations contained within Appendix A of their letter dated March 15, 1991.

Section 3. That this resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
