A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING MITCH SEAVEY'S COMMEMORATIVE SLED DOG RUN OF THE HISTORIC IDITAROD TRAIL BEGINNING AT MILE "0" IN SEWARD

- WHEREAS, in the late 1800's and early 1900's successive gold strikes from the Klondike to Nome energized a massive migration to the gold fields with many miners traveling through Seward to the interior and Nome; and
- WHEREAS, Seward has been designated as Mile "0" of the Iditarod National Historic Trail; and
- WHEREAS, the Iditarod Sled Dog Race to Nome has become a significant event commemorating this early transportation route to Nome; and
- WHEREAS, on February 25, 1995, Mitch Seavey will be the first musher in history to begin the Iditarod Sled Dog Race with a ceremonial start at Mile "0" of the Historic Iditarod Trail:

- SECTION 1. That the Kenai Peninsula Borough supports and encourages Mitch Seavey's commemorative dog sled race run from Mile "0" in Seward.
