A RESOLUTION TO INCLUDE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE NATIVE VILLAGE OF TYONEK IN THE BOROUGH'S 1995 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITY LIST

- WHEREAS, the Native Village of Tyonek Council represents the unincorporated community of Tyonek, located within the boundaries of the Kenai Peninsula Borough; and
- WHEREAS, the Council desires to provide adequate fire protection for the residents of Tyonek, Alaska; and
- WHEREAS, the Council has determined the replacement of fire hydrants and renovations of the fire station to be the number one and two priorities for the community; and
- WHEREAS, the Village recently installed a sewer project which drains household waste into a 10,000 gallon holding tank but currently does not have any equipment to remove the sludge accumulating in the holding tank; and
- WHEREAS, the Council, as its number three priority, would like to purchase a sanitation truck to keep the water and sewer system operable year round and to eliminate any health hazards that may arise; and
- **WHEREAS**, the funding requested by the Village would provide much needed jobs for the residents;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

**SECTION 1.** That the capital improvement projects listed below in priority order shall be included in the KPB's 1995 Legislative Priority List under unincorporated communities:

1.	Replacement of 7 fire hydrants	\$90,000
2.	Fire station renovations	<b>\$</b> 61,600
3	Sanitation truck nurchase	\$145,000
