## A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING HOUSE BILL 150 AND SENATE BILL 97 APPROVING A LEASE PURCHASE AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF SEWARD FOR CONSTRUCTION AND OPERATION OF AN ADDITION TO SPRING CREEK CORRECTIONAL FACILITY

- **WHEREAS**, the state prison population reached a record high of 3,351 inmates in February of 1997; and
- WHEREAS, under the Cleary Consent Decree the State is being fined on a daily basis for over crowding with the total figure exceeding \$2,000,000 and growing daily; and
- WHEREAS, Alaskan inmates are being housed in a privately-owned prison in Florence, Arizona, resulting in lost jobs and revenue to the State of Alaska; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Spring Creek Correctional Facility was originally designed and constructed with plans for expansion; and,
- **WHEREAS,** the City of Seward is willing to Bond in order to provide a more economic solution to prison overcrowded; and
- WHEREAS, Representative Gary Davis and Senator John Torgerson have introduced H.B. 150 and S.B. 97 approving a lease-purchase agreement with the City of Seward for construction and operation of an addition to Spring Creek Correctional Facility; and

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

- **SECTION 1.** The Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly supports House Bill 150 and Senate Bill 97.
