KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH RESOLUTION 98-017

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING PASSAGE OF SENATE BILL 208, WHICH WOULD REQUIRE VOTER APPROVAL FOR THE FORMATION, ALTERATION OR ABOLISHMENT OF CERTAIN SERVICE AREAS

- WHEREAS, the Alaska Constitution provides for maximum local self-government with a minimum of local government units, that all local government powers shall be vested in boroughs and cities, and that the borough assembly may establish, alter or abolish service areas, subject to the provisions of law or charter; and
- WHEREAS, Senate Bill 208 would require voter approval for the alteration or abolishment of all service areas, and for the formation of certain new service areas; and
- WHEREAS, Senate Bill 208 would allow non-resident property owners to vote on all issues affecting service areas; and
- WHEREAS, the assembly regards voting and public involvement as very important to the democratic process; and
- WHEREAS, Senate Bill 208 appears to violate the intent of the Alaska Constitution; and
- WHEREAS, Senate Bill 208 would enable a minority of the affected population in proposed service areas to essentially veto an action that may be in the best interests of the people of the municipality as a whole;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:

- **SECTION 1.** The Kenai Peninsula Borough assembly strongly opposes Senate Bill 208.
- **SECTION 2.** That copies of this resolution shall be mailed to members of the state legislature and to Governor Tony Knowles.
