RESOLUTION 2005-018**

**A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE STERLING COMMUNITY CLUB, INC. GRANT  
APPLICATION TO THE DENALI COMMISSION FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A  
COMMUNITY MULTI-USE FACILITY**

**WHEREAS,** Sterling, an unincorporated community with approximately 4,800 residents, initiated a grass roots effort and developed an outdoor community area complete with a baseball field, hockey rink, picnic area and playground; and

**WHEREAS,** there is no large facility in Sterling for community activities such as youth meetings and functions, sporting events, hall rentals and other indoor functions; and

**WHEREAS,** the Sterling Community Club, Inc. has documented the need and support for such a multi-use facility through three community surveys; and

**WHEREAS,** the Sterling Community Club, Inc. wishes to construct a facility approximately 13,000 square feet which could house such occupants as Head Start, a library, a museum and a branch of the Boys and Girls Club; and

**WHEREAS,** such a multi-use facility would be utilized by residents and visitors thereby increasing economic opportunities for local businesses; and

**WHEREAS,** Congress recently completed its annual appropriations process and included \$5 million to the Denali Commission for certain communities to construct multi-purpose community facilities and Sterling was one of the recognized communities;


**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH:**

**SECTION 1.** That the Assembly of the Kenai Peninsula Borough supports the efforts of the Sterling Community Club, Inc. to secure grant funding from the Denali Commission to construct a community multi-purpose facility.

**SECTION 2.** That the Kenai Peninsula Borough urges the Denali Commission to fund this grant request.
