






Population of Economic Impact Areas - 2006



Population by CDP - 2000 v 2006 (Green)




Population Estimates of Similar CDP's 2000 (Bold) v 2006 (Shaded)






Median Age of Similar CDP's

Census 2000




Median Age - KPB Cities - Census 2000


KPB Percentage Change by Age Cohort



Population Change by Census









KPB Sales – Gross v Taxable




KPB Gross and Taxable Sales by Quarter




KPB Taxable Sales - Retail as a Portion





in Millions \$




Gross Sales - 2006





Kenai Taxable Sales - Tourism v Total



Soldotna Taxable Sales - Tourism v Total




Homer Taxable Sales - Tourism v Total


Seward Taxable Sales - Tourism v Total

3rd Qtr Tourism Sales by City



(NAICS)





2006 Accommodations & Food Services Taxable Sales by Area






