

Central Peninsula Landfill

Waste Segregation – Large Commercial Disposers

Waste deposited at the Central Peninsula Landfill (Soldotna Landfill) must be properly segregated prior to disposal. Below are the main four categories of waste that need to be segregated. Each category has examples of items that can be mixed in one container:

Construction Demolition Debris

- Bricks
- Masonry Materials
- Sheetrock
- Concrete
- Plaster
- Stones
- Construction generated cardboard
- Pavement
- Tires
- Drywall
- Plastic Drums
- Visqueen
- Floor Covering
- Rock
- Wall Coverings
- Insulation
- Roofing Materials
- Wiring
- Plastic Pipe
- Rope (longer than 20' must be coiled and bound)
- Wood (small quantities of scrap, lumber, etc. – should not exceed 3 or 4 cubic yards per roll off container)

Metals

- Appliances (White Goods)
- Metal Banding (must be bound or containerized)
- Scrap Metals
- Steel Cable (longer than 15' must be coiled and bound)
- Tanks
- Pipe (including plumbing)
- Drums
- Chain
- Automotive or boat parts

Wood/Landclearing Debris

- Stumps
- Brush
- Tree Limbs
- Logs
- Chips
- Sawdust (hog-fuel)
- Wood Shavings
- Bark
- Pallets
- Plywood
- Building Lumber
- Scrap Wood

Mixed Solid Waste

- Household Waste
- Food Waste
- Paper
- Plastic
- Glass
- Cans
- Office Waste
- Lawn/Garden Waste (grass, leaves, etc.)

All items listed in a category **can** be mixed together in one container, for example; visqueen, plaster, concrete, floor covering, etc. under Construction Demolition Debris can be mixed together in a single container.

Items from differing categories **cannot** be mixed together (unless approval is obtained from the landfill operator prior to disposal) for example; Mixed Solid Waste items cannot be mixed with Construction Demolition Debris items and Metals cannot be mixed with Wood/Landclearing Debris.

Improperly segregated containers (more than one waste category) and/or loads containing or suspected of containing hazardous waste will be denied for disposal.

Special Waste

- Pit Liners
- Sandblast Material
- Ash
- Fire Extinguisher Powder
- Empty Gas Cylinders
- Street Sweepings

“Special Wastes” are non-hazardous waste materials and residue from industrial processes/facilities (see above) and other materials that require prior notice and/or special arrangements for handling at the landfill. In most instances disposers will need written authorization from the Borough, prior to making disposal. Disposers may be required to submit documentation (MSDS, test reports, etc.) substantiating materials are non-hazardous.
